

## Education | 2016-2017 Assessment Report

1. Please give a brief overview of the assessment data you collected this year.

We collected data from the edTPA assessment. Students are externally evaluated on Planning for Instruction (standard #7), Instructional Strategies (standard #8) and Assessment (standard #6). Each student seeking teacher licensure was required to have a passing score on this assessment before being endorsed with the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction.

Students select a handbook based on the developmental level and/or a particular content. Since students have a wide range of handbooks or assessment that they can submit for evaluation, there are some handbooks that had too few students use to get a valid data set. However, overall pass rates are very high. The few students that re-submitted all or part of their edTPA to be re-evaluated, all passed on their second attempt.

The test scores by handbook and by task are indicated here, with a comparison to the state and national scores. While the scores of our students may be slightly lower, they are still passing the assessment.
